

UZBEKISTAN

Most of the prisoners below are **Sunni Muslims** who have been accused of alleged separatism, extremism, planning to overthrow the government and/or belonging to a banned Islamist movement. They are not known to have committed acts of violence.

Followers of the Turkish theologian **Said Nursi**, who lived and died in the 19th - 20th century, were also imprisoned although they do not use or advocate violence or terrorism. Nursi's works are banned in Uzbekistan for allegedly inciting hatred and enmity against non-believers, which is not the case.

Four Sufi leaders were sentenced to prison terms because their religious group has not been registered by the state and is therefore deemed illegal.

Two Protestants were sentenced to five days administrative detention in 2018 for worshipping without state permission.

Charges: Possession of "illegal" Islamic religious materials on his mobile phone

Article of the criminal/civil/administrative code: Criminal Code Article 246, Part 1 (Smuggling, that is carriage through the customs border without the knowledge of or with concealment from customs control... [weapons, narcotics, etc.] or of materials that propagandize religious extremism, separatism, and fundamentalism shall be punished with five to ten years imprisonment)

Last court decision: On 9th December 2016, he was sentenced to a three-year term of imprisonment in a labour camp.

Place of detention: Prison UYa 64/61, in Karshi, in Kashkadarya Region

Other information: He is an ethnic Uzbek, Russian citizen, born in Kyrgyzstan. Relatives expressed concern over his health, as he had a liver operation shortly before his arrest.

Last court decision: On 25th May 2016, he was sentenced to five years imprisonment.

Other information: He was arrested alongside Jonibek TURDIBOYEV. The prosecutors used the testimony of a jailed relative, Madatjon INAMUTDINOV, to convict him.

Last court decision: On 22nd November 2012, he was sentenced to seven years in prison by the Yukorichirchik District Court.

Age: 24 years old

Date and place of arrest: On 4th March 2016, in Krasnoyarsk, Russia

Charges: Enciting ethnic, racial, or religious hatred, attempt to undermine the constitutional order of Uzbekistan, and participation in a religious extremist organization

Statement of the defendant: He claims that while in Russia he accessed online sermons and teachings of religious leaders and performed Islamic prayers. He also accessed media from Uzbekistani imams and copied their photographs to his social media page.

Article of the criminal/civil/administrative code: Criminal Code Articles 156 (Acts intended to humiliate ethnic honour and dignity, insult the religious or atheistic feelings of individuals, carried out with the purpose of inciting hatred, intolerance, or divisions on a national, ethnic, racial, or religious basis, as well as the explicit or implicit limitation of rights or preferences on the basis of national, racial, or ethnic origin, or religious beliefs), 159 (Attempts to change the Constitutional order of Uzbekistan), and 244-2, Part 1 (Creation, leadership or participation in religious extremist, separatist, fundamentalist or other banned organisations, punishable by five to fifteen years in prison).

First court decision: He was sentenced to seven years in prison by the Fergana Regional Court.

Last court decision: The sentence was upheld by the court of appeals.

Place of detention: Prison colony 64/61 in Karshi

Other information: Torture and ill treatment have been used against him to force false confessions to the crimes that he alleges he did not commit.

Mr. Usmonkov was one among several bloggers arrested for "freely publishing their opinions on religious freedoms on Facebook and other social media and for criticising the authorities for restricting women wearing hijab in public places and state institutions, men growing beards and children attending Mosque".

Article of the criminal/civil/administrative code: Criminal Code Article 244-1, Part 3 (a) ([1] Production, storage, [2] distribution or display of ideas, materials or symbols containing a threat to public security and public order, punishable by imprisonment between five and eight years, or a fine of between three-hundred to four-hundred times the minimum monthly wage, [3] [a] if conducted by a group or with prior planning)

Last court decision: On 22nd November 2012, he was sentenced to seven years in prison by the Yukorichirchik District Court.

Place of detention: Yangibazar Detention Centre in Tashkent Region

Latip Talipovich YUSUPOV

Date of birth: 22nd December 1970

Date and place of arrest: On 1st October 2016

Charges: Meeting with others in homes and teahouses to discuss their faith between 2008 and 2016, talking about the need to establish an Islamic Caliphate in Uzbekistan, planning to overthrow the government and supporting a banned radical Islamic movement

Article of the criminal/civil/administrative code: Criminal Code Article 244-2, Part 1 (Creation, leadership or participation in religious extremist, separatist, fundamentalist or other banned organisations, punishable by five to fifteen years in prison) and Articles 159, Part 3, Point a (acts punishable under Part 1 or Part 2 of Article 159 committed repeatedly or by a dangerous recidivist)

Last court decision: On 26th May 2017, he was sentenced to six years' imprisonment in an ordinary regime labour camp by Tashkent City Criminal Court. He appealed against the verdict.

Place of detention: Interior Ministry's Detention Centre No. 1 in Tashkent

Other information: The months he spent in pre-trial detention will count towards his sentence. He was tried alongside Davron Yuldashevich FAYZIYEV, Khusnuddin Tokhtamurodovich RIZAYEV, Dilshod Khikmatullayevich KAMILOV, Abdurashid Abdulkhayevich RASHIDOV, Khusnuddin Abdulkhakimovich INAGAMOV, Afzaljon Azatovich URUNOV, Ravshan Mukhamadovich MIRZAYEV, Sobirjon Sotvoldiyevich KHASANOV, Bakhadyr Bakhtiyarovich SADYKOV and Ravshan Bakhtiyarovich SADYKOV. He has already been convicted in the early 2000s for allegedly being a member of the banned radical religious movement Hizb ut-Tahrir.

Article of the criminal/civil/administrative code: Criminal Code Article 244-1, Part 3 (a) ([1] Production, storage, [2] distribution or display of ideas, materials or symbols containing a threat to public security and public order, punishable by imprisonment between five and eight years, or a fine of between three-hundred to four-hundred times the minimum monthly wage, [3] [a] if conducted by a group or with prior planning) and Article 244-2, Part 1 (Creation, leadership or participation in religious extremist, separatist, fundamentalist or other banned organisations, punishable by five to fifteen years in prison).

First court decision: He was sentenced to six years in prison.

Last court decision: In 2015, his term of imprisonment was extended to an additional three years in a labour camp.

Other information: Officials told Tukhtamurodov and his relatives that he will not be freed until the authorities get back his brother Bobirjon Tukhtamurodov from Russia, where he sought refuge in January 2010.

Date and place of arrest: On 1st June 2016, in Bukharan Region

Charges: Participation in an illegal (not state-sanctioned) religious group

Article of the criminal/civil/administrative code: Criminal Code Article 216 (Illegal establishment or reactivation of illegal public associations or religious organisations shall be punished with a fine and imprisonment of up to five years; participation in such a group, illegal religious activity, or in present of minors shall be punishable by a fine or imprisonment up to three years).

Last court decision: On 1st June 2016, the four religious leaders were sentenced to four years in prison.

Other information: Names of the four prisoners are currently unknown.

Date and place of arrest: Around 21st June 2018 in Karshi (Qarshi)

Charges: Meeting for worship without state permission and pointing out that he and his fellow Baptists did not break the Constitution or international human rights law.

Article of the criminal/civil/administrative code: Criminal Code Article 240 (Violation of the Religion Law).

First Court decision: Five days in prison

Other information: Altogether four members of a Baptist congregation meeting were apprehended, fined several days wages. The judge had not specified which law had been broken. They were threatened by judge KHUSHVAKTOV that if they continue their practises he will open a criminal case against them
